MARKET SUMMARY: The plateau remains active with 13 properties pending. We are entering what I call BFF season, buy in fall and football. We are seeing more price reductions than new inventory and homes are staying longer on the market. The bargain hunters are entering the market which keeps our local market active. The Feds decision not to raise interest rates has also helped those on the fence about financing, jump off and get serious. I expect to see a steady amount of activity in the market but not much of an increase in pricing. If you know a bargain hunter interested in buying real estate, have them give me a call.

MONTHLY TIP: They say it is coming and it is going to be huge and vicious. The El Nino predictions can be scary but we are in great need of rain, just maybe not so much all at one time. Here are some tips to help you through the upcoming winter. Take a good look at your trees and root systems. Trees have become weakened form the drought and may topple with the anticipated high winds. Fix any fences that are starting to lean. Take a look at retaining walls for cracking or rotation. Check drains, and culverts to keep them free of debris. If there are areas that have flooded in the past have it looked at by a contractor or structural/geological engineer. Sometimes, it is simply a matter of having a small French drain installed. Clean out all your rain gutters. Take a look at your flood insurance if you have it. There are parts of Murrieta that are in a 50-100 year flood zone and there are streets prone to water accumulation. Prepare an emergency kit for power outages. Look at the storm drains on your street. Are they free of debris? For city owned streets, you can call (951)461-6400 to have them cleaned. Maybe now is the time to invest in a rain capture system for your home. Above all, plan ahead and be prepared.
